## **“NCEA” – a national qualification is:**

The government providing you with a certificate which tells “everyone” you have reached a particular level of knowledge and skill.

# **National Certificate of Educational Attainment (NCEA) has 3 levels**

**Level 1 NCEA**

**usually completed in Year 11**

**Level 2 NCEA**

**usually completed in Year 12**

**Level 3 NCEA**

**usually completed in Year 13**

**any level can be gained over more than one year**

# Level 1 NCEA

Each course (subject) is divided into Standards

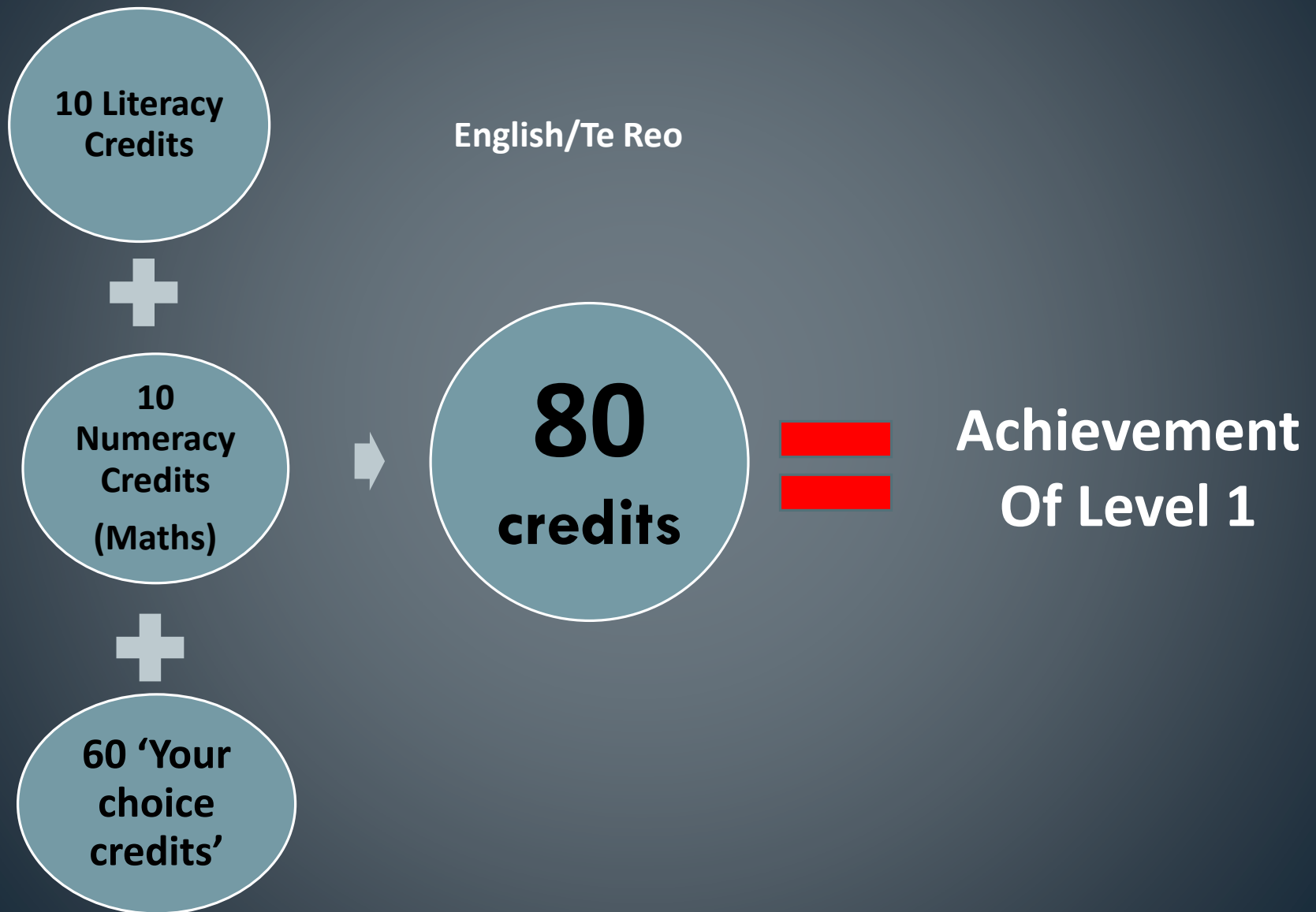
Each standard is worth a set number of credits

Some standards are Achievement Standards, some are Unit Standards

# Achievement / Unit Standards

All Achievement Standards and some Unit Standards will be assessed to 4 grades:

- Non-Achieved – the standard is not met.
- Achievement – the standard is met.
- With Merit – shows very good work.
- With Excellence – outstanding skills or depth of understanding.

Remaining Unit Standards assessed only to Achieved level

Achievement Standards are identified as Internally assessed, Externally assessed (traditional exam)

Unit Standards are all internally assessed.

# Literacy & Numeracy Requirements

- NCEA Level 1 Literacy/Numeracy requirements – 10 credits

Based on either literacy/numeracy Unit Standards

Or on an identified wide range of Achievement Standards (Level 1 upwards)

Student result notices will say either:

‘Literacy/Numeracy requirement met by Achievement Standards’ or  
‘Literacy/Numeracy requirement met by Unit Standards’

- Literacy requirement may be met by Achievement Standards and the Numeracy requirement by Unit Standards or visa versa.



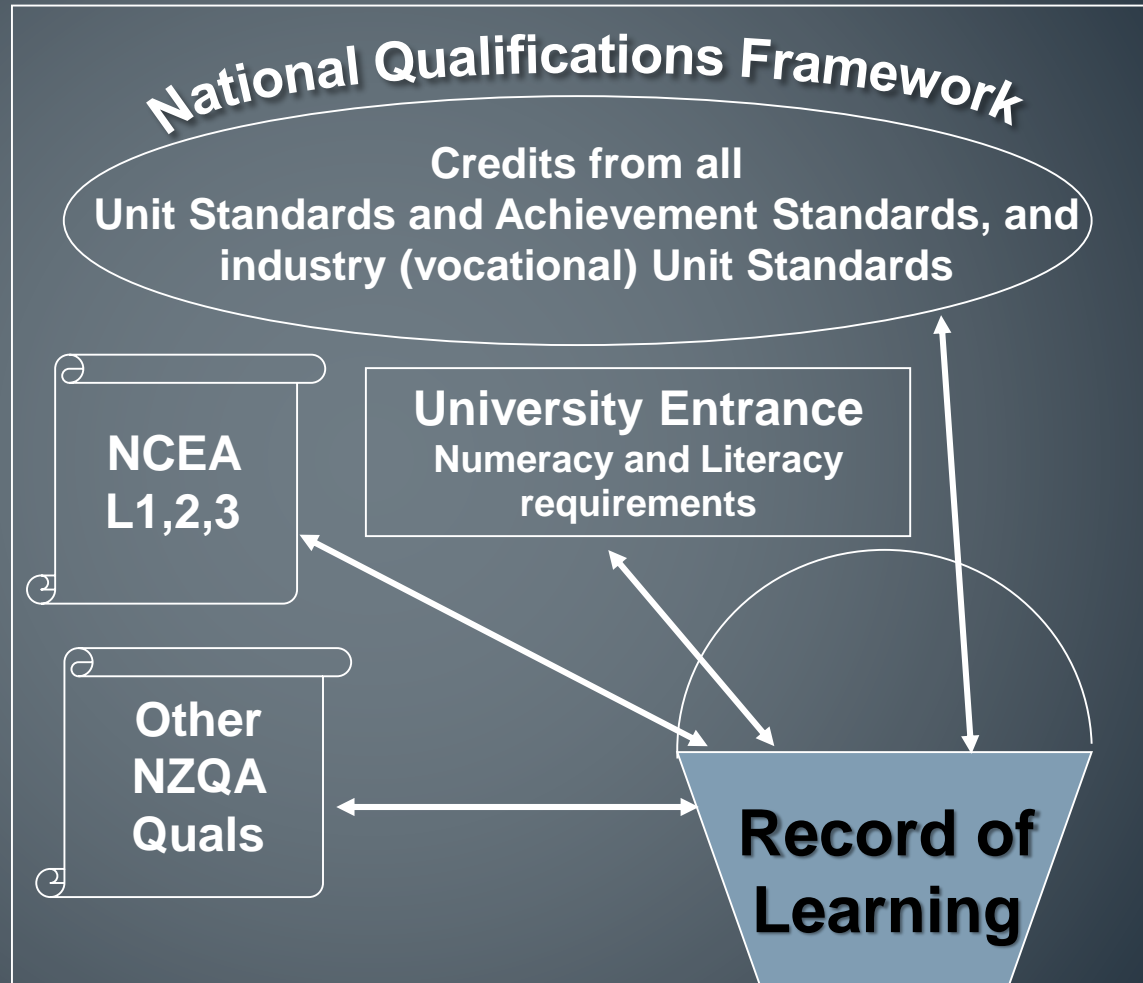
# NZQA connecting with students

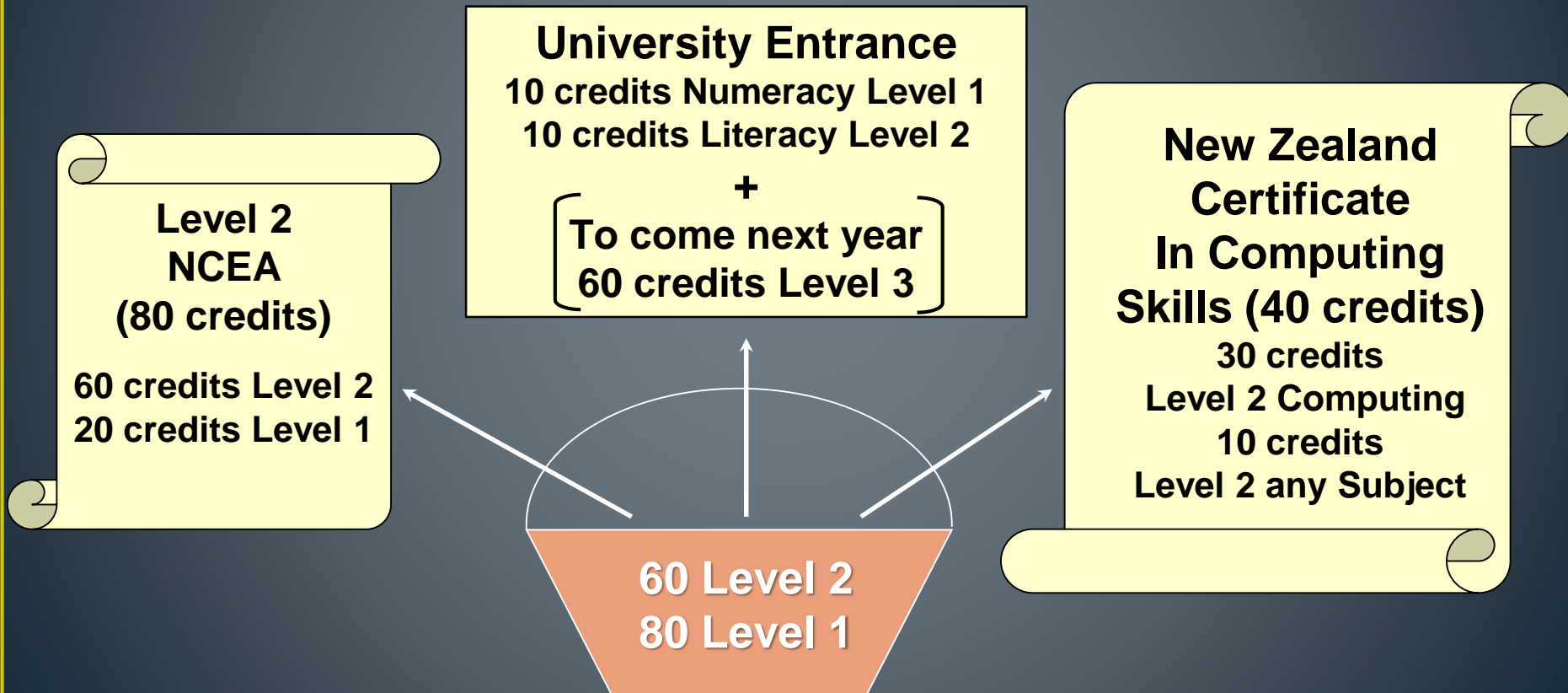

# Certificate Endorsements

- Eligibility for endorsement is based on credits achieved for which appropriate fees have been paid and is awarded on the release of results in January.
- Standards achieved in January each year by a candidate will be used to calculate the highest certificate endorsement for which the candidate is eligible. This only happens once per year.
- For a merit endorsement an endorsed certificate can be issued to candidates who have achieved 50 credits at Merit or Excellence at the same level, or higher on the New Zealand Qualifications Framework (NZQF), as the certificate being awarded.
- Credits can be accumulated over more than one year for the purposes of Certificate endorsement.
- Only one endorsed certificate will be awarded in a year unless a candidate has achieved two or three NCEA levels.



# Course Endorsements Levels 1, 2 and 3

- Course (subject) endorsement will provide recognition for students who perform exceptionally well in individual courses. (From NZQA's point of view they accept a school subject as an identified course for the purpose of endorsement). There are 4 criteria:
  1. 14 or more credits at Excellence = course endorsed with Excellence
  2. 14 credits at merit or higher = course endorsed with Merit
  3. At least 3 credits from externals and 3 credits from internals
  4. Sufficient credits in a single school year.
- NZQA Course name will be the Otumoetai College subject name.
- The result for a standard can only be used in one course endorsement within the school year that it is reported.
- NZQA will award a maximum of one endorsement for each course.

# Vocational Pathways

- A tool to help students understanding what possible careers their credit count (qualification) focuses them towards.
- Every standards is 'attached' to one of six career pathways.

## ENGLISH – L3ENGA

Course Entry	Entry to this course is by invitation from the HOD.
Course Overview	This course provides an opportunity for students to engage with and enjoy a wide range of texts. Possibilities include a novel or play, a selection of poetry or short stories, film, Shakespeare, and unfamiliar texts. Also, students will produce two extended pieces of writing, investigate connections in literature and deliver an oral presentation. Wide readings and ideas will be discussed in this course to allow those who choose, to take part in the Scholarship examination.
Assessment	This course will be assessed to a selection of Level Three English Achievement Standards. Assessment is a combination of both internally and externally assessed standards.

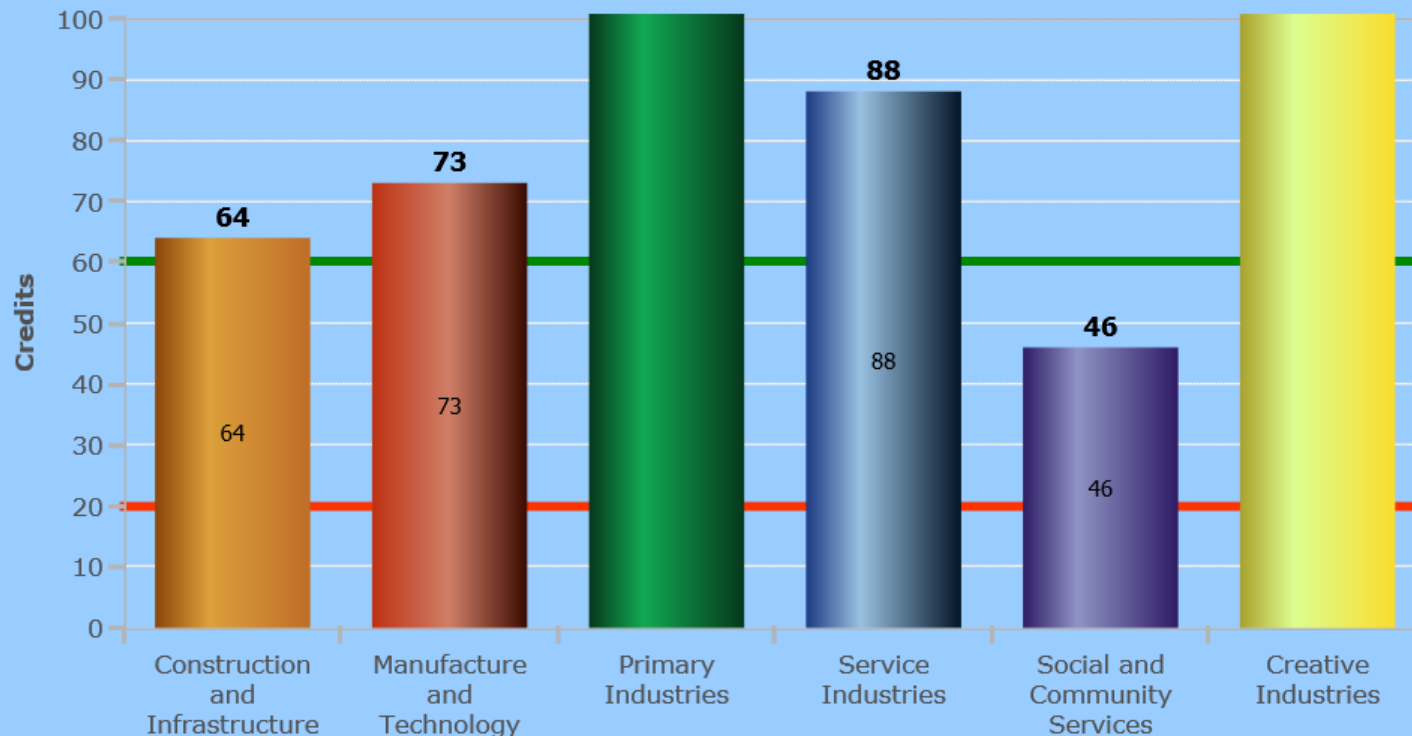
